This year we have been under construction. We are so close to opening our new addition just trying to get over a last few permitting requirements. We just want each of you to know how much we appreciate your support and prayers. We like to thank you for your **generous** donations that you have sent this past year.

Attached to this letter is the Good Samaritan 2024 Impact Statement. It will update you on things going on this past year at the clinic. Just to know this is the big picture it would be impossible to list all the individual things that we have done to help those in need with medical issues as well as other things. We continue to ask the churches and the community to let us know if you have any activity that you would like us to come and share our Message. Also, we would be willing to come and share how we reach out to our neighbors and provide volunteer opportunities to you members. We will work with you to arrange a time to do such. AS always, we continue to reach out for grants and volunteers. Good Samaritan only has one full-time employee, and all other positions are filled by volunteers. We have multiple physicians who volunteer their time and talents, but we can always use more. This year we recorded 1,065 volunteer hours, which is down from last year. Our volunteer base is falling, and we need more individuals who would be willing to donate their time. We truly would like this Clinic to be run by volunteers to ensure each can receive the blessings that each volunteer receives every time they serve here. Volunteers are always needed for nursing, administration, gardening, mowing, cleaning, and our most important service is spiritual counseling. Every patient is individually given spiritual counseling and prayer and we are always in need of those willing to preform those services.

As you can see it was awesome year. We always want to first give God all the glory for our accomplishments and successes. We also want to recognize the faithfulness and generosity of our partners, volunteers, and donors. The thing we are most excited about is currently moving into our new addition. We are moving forward to provide a forever home for the clinic.

2024 Impact Report

Good Samaritan Free Clinic and the Board of Directors celebrates the clinic's 20th Anniversary on January 17, 2025. It has been serving the community by providing free health care, medications, treatment, and spiritual care to the uninsured, and the most vulnerable populations in our community since 2005.

There is so much to celebrate and to be proud of. Good Samaritan continues to build on the rich legacy started 20 years ago. First, the clinic was able to purchase its forever

home in 2022, Second, the clinic completed the new addition to the existing structure in November 2024. The new sidewalks, stairs, and patio, funded by a Community Development Block grant and awarded in 2023, will be completed soon. The ribbon cutting will be scheduled early spring. The expansion and sidewalk are made possible by grant funding in 2022 and 2023 respectfully.

The clinic reached over 750 people through various clinics and community outreach events.




Patient Care

On December 23, 2024, Good Samaritan reached 1000 unique, active patients in the electronic medical record "Practice Fusion". The electronic medical record was implemented in August 2022 replacing a paper charting system.

The clinic remained consistent with the number of patients seen. It continues to provide a weekly outreach clinic onsite to the Martinsburg Rescue Mission. It provides treatment, medications, and assistance in helping eligible mission residents to establish care in the community.
